- Jeff Sielaff from Preble High School gave a talk relating informational facts for the Green Bay Public Schools System referendum. Referendum is for replacement and repair only, no new building. There will be two informational meetings for the public to attend:
March 18th @ Elmore Elementary School at 6PM
March 30th @ East High School at 6PM
